In this interactive workshop, Marla Martin Hanley will guide participants to explore and practice, in a series of “global café” conversations, Parker Palmer’s five “habits of the heart” (described in his new book “Healing the Heart of Democracy: The Courage to Create a Politics Worthy of the Human Spirit”). These skills are nourished in small “pre-political venues,” such as families, classrooms, and congregations. What role might women leaders play to maximize the Church’s power to educate and nourish the human heart?

Marla Martin Hanley has been a social worker in the field of family counseling, a professor and academic administrator, a workshop trainer and author. For over thirty years, she has worked with small groups in college classrooms and community organizations teaching communication skills, analyzing the strengths and challenge of American culture, and exploring the history and processes of social justice work. This workshop will be an engaging and active experience of learning from one another and identifying how women can lead – from the heart.
